INTRODUCTION :

It is often taken for granted that Islam as a civilisation has something distinctive to offer to contemporary global challenges. We hold that the magnitude of the challenges on the question of sustainability calls for a whole-of-civilisation approach such that the best insights, wisdom and practices from the 1000-year experience of Islamic civilisation are benefitted from accordingly.
